PROPOSED HIGHWAY CLOSURE ASQUITH AVENUE, BIRKENHEAD (BIRKENHEAD WARD) SECTION 257 TOWN & COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 To request Members' approval to commence the legal proceedings for the permanent closure of a section of unadopted passageway in Asquith Avenue, Birkenhead.

2.0 REPORT

- 2.1 The Department of Education and Cultural Services Community Safety Section, on behalf of the residents has submitted a proposal to close the length of passageway highlighted on the plan.
- 2.2 It is proposed that gates be erected due to unsociable behaviour taking place in the passageway which is between 2-24 Asquith Avenue and 114-128 Duke Street, Birkenhead.
- 2.3 If successful, properties adjoining the passageway will gain greater security.

3.0 FINANCIAL AND STAFFING IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The closure will be carried out by existing staff as part of their normal duties. All legal and administration costs will be met by the Community Safety Fund.
