PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLE LICENCE - APPLICATION

1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 Members are asked to consider whether they are willing to re-license the following vehicle: a Ford Mondeo, registration number X448 OSS, beyond the normal over-age date for a licensed private hire vehicle.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The current private hire vehicle licence conditions do not allow a vehicle to be licensed beyond the date eight years from the date of first registration, unless the Council is satisfied that the vehicle is suitable, having regard to mileage, appearance, condition and safety features. This condition relating to the age of the vehicle was imposed to improve the standard of vehicle being licensed for private hire.
- 2.2 Private hire vehicle licences are issued on a twelve monthly basis, however once a vehicle reaches six years old, six monthly licences are issued until the vehicle reaches eight years old.
- 2.3 Once a vehicle reaches eight years old, if the proprietor considers it to be in exceptional condition an application can be made to re-license the vehicle for a further six months. That licence can be issued under delegated authority, subject to the vehicle being inspected by officers and being considered to be suitable as in paragraph 2.1 above. Any further application cannot be granted under delegated authority and must be referred to the Licensing Panel.

3.0 APPLICATION

- 3.1 The proprietor of the vehicle, Mr Moscripn has applied to re-license the vehicle as he considers it to be in exceptional condition.
- 3.2 The vehicle has been licensed as a private hire vehicle since 27 October 2006 and the current licence expired on 28 February 2009.
- 3.3 The date of first registration of this vehicle is 1 September 2000.
- 3.4 On expiry of the previous licence on 1 September 2008, an application was made for a further six month licence, thereby extending it beyond the vehicle's eighth birthday and after inspection and a satisfactory compliance test at Walsh Autos, the Council's authorised testing station, the licence was granted under delegated powers.
- 3.5 The vehicle has been examined at Walsh Autos and the pass slip is attached to this report at Appendix A.

1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 Members are asked to consider whether they are willing to re-license the following vehicle: a Toyota Avensis, registration number W249 RDM, beyond the normal over-age date for a licensed private hire vehicle.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The current private hire vehicle licence conditions do not allow a vehicle to be licensed beyond the date eight years from the date of first registration, unless the Council is satisfied that the vehicle is suitable, having regard to mileage, appearance, condition and safety features. This condition relating to the age of the vehicle was imposed to improve the standard of vehicle being licensed for private hire.
- 2.2 Private hire vehicle licences are issued on a twelve monthly basis, however once a vehicle reaches six years old, six monthly licences are issued until the vehicle reaches eight years old.
- 2.3 Once a vehicle reaches eight years old, if the proprietor considers it to be in exceptional condition an application can be made to re-license the vehicle for a further six months. That licence can be issued under delegated authority, subject to the vehicle being inspected by officers and being considered to be suitable as in paragraph 2.1 above. Any further application cannot be granted under delegated authority and must be referred to the Licensing Panel.

3.0 APPLICATION

- 3.1 The proprietor of the vehicle, Mr Shingler has applied to re-license the vehicle as he considers it to be in exceptional condition.
- 3.2 The vehicle has been licensed as a private hire vehicle since 9 February 2005 and the current licence is due to expire on 8 February 2009.
- 3.3 The date of first registration of this vehicle is 24 March 2000.
- 3.4 On expiry of a previous licence on 9 February 2008, an application was made for a further six month licence, thereby extending it beyond the vehicle's eighth birthday and after inspection and a satisfactory compliance test at Walsh Autos, the Council's authorised testing station, the licence was granted under delegated powers.
- 3.5 On expiry of that licence on 8 August 2008, an application was considered by the Licensing Panel to grant a further six month licence. The application was granted.

3.6 The vehicle has been examined at Walsh Autos and the pass slip is attached to this report.

PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLE LICENCE – VAUXHALL VIVARO - APPLICATION TO LICENSE TWO FRONT SEAT PASSENGERS

1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application to license a Vauxhall Vivaro as a private hire vehicle to carry eight passengers, two passengers being carried in the front.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Council policy, which is reflected in the Private Hire Vehicle Licence Conditions, allows non-standard vehicles (ie MPV's, people carriers) to be licensed as private hire vehicles subject to the standard Private Hire Vehicle Licence Conditions and the following additional conditions:-
 - (1) There must only be the number of passengers seats fitted in the vehicle for which the vehicle is licensed.
 - (2) Two fire extinguishers must be kept in the vehicle, one to be in the front and the other in the rear.
 - (3) Vehicles to be fitted (in addition to the front drivers and passengers doors) with at least two side/rear opening doors and all doors must be easily accessible to all passengers and capable of being opened from inside.
 - (4) A step (which must be approved by the Council) must be available for use at all times.
 - (5) A sign on the rear of the seats in the vehicle must be displayed indicating there is a step available for use and indicating exit doors.
 - (6) Seat belts shall be provided for every passengers the vehicle is licensed by this Council to carry.
- 2.2 The standard private hire vehicle conditions specify that the proprietor shall only allow one person to be carried in the front of the vehicle apart from the driver.
- 2.3 Members have previously considered applications to license a Volkswagen Caravelle, a Volkswagen Transporter, a Ford Tourneo and a Renault Trafic to carry two front seat passengers. These applications were granted.

3.0 APPLICATION

- 3.1 The proprietor of the Vauxhall Vivaro, Mr Paul Kenyon has applied to license the vehicle to carry 2 front seat passengers. The vehicle is currently licensed to carry just one front seat passenger.
- 3.2 Mr Kenyon considers that two passengers can be carried in the front of the vehicle in comfort and safety.
- 3.3 The vehicle will be available for inspection prior to the start of the meeting.
