1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the review of a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 RELEVANT BACKGROUND

2.1 Simply Food and Drinks currently has a Premises Licence to allow the following Licensable Activities:

Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Saturday 08:00 to 23:00 Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Non-Standard Timings

Good Friday 08:00 to 22:30

Christmas Day 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30

- 2.2 A copy of the Premises Licence setting out the above hours and conditions attached to the licence is available.
- 2.3 The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may, having regard to the application for review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Modify the Licence conditions (permanently or for a temporary period of up to 3 months).
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence (permanently or for a temporary period of up to 3 months).
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor (if applicable).
 - Suspend the Licence for a period not more than 3 months.
 - Revoke the Licence.

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

- 3.1 An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as Simply Food and Drinks, 24B Wellington Road, Oxton. The conduct of these premises are a cause of concern to Merseyside Police.

Since September 2008 there have been three test purchases conducted and this has resulted in two sales on 17/09/08 and 05/03/09.

The history of this premises is as follows:-

17/09/08 Test Purchase - sale 31/10/08 Test purchase - no sale 05/03/09 Test Purchase - sale

The History of the above Police Test Purchases is as follows:-

On 17th September 2008 a under age volunteer entered the store and purchased a bottle of wine. There were no questions asked and the sale was completed. This was witnessed by Police Officers. A short time later Constable Barrell returned to the store and spoke to the seller Christopher HENDY. A short PACE interview was conducted and he was then issued with a fixed penalty notice. The Designated Premises Supervisor, Steven Fuller was later interviewed by Constable Cottrell and produced due diligence. No further action was taken in respect of the sale.

On 31st October 2008 the sale of alcohol was refused to an under age volunteer.

On 5th March 2009 a under age volunteer entered the store and purchased a bottle of wine There were no questions asked and the sale was completed. This was witnessed by Police Officers. A short time later Constable Jones returned to the store and spoke with the seller Gemma ROBERTS. A short PACE interview was conducted and she was then issued with a fixed penalty notice. The DPS Deborah Stott, was later interviewed and due diligence was produced. No further action was taken.

These premises are located in a residential area. There can be no doubt that the selling of alcohol to under age persons can lead to an increase in anti social behaviour. It also impacts on the health of the young people and can make them more vulnerable to becoming a victim of crime. In addition it clearly undermines the licensing objective of protecting children from harm Merseyside Police accept that due diligence has been accepted following each sale however clearly the fact that two sales have taken place within seven months suggests that the due diligence in operation is not effective.

It is suggested that the following conditions be placed on the licence to ensure due dilligence is implemented and maintained.

1. Adoption of Think 21 policy and display of appropriate posters.

- 2 . Acceptance of passport, photo driving licence or passaccredited identification only in support of till checks.
- 3. Maintainance of refusal log with regular checks bymanagement to ensure that it is

- 5. Regular staff training, training records maintained and that staff attend Trading Standards training when arranged.



Reference application to vary a Premises Licence in respect of Terrace C of 184 Telegraph Road, Heswall CH60 OAJ.

To whom it may concern;

Further to the above application I would like the following points and objections to be taken into account regarding any variation(s) at the above premises.

The premises occupied by Terrace C, the subject of this application, are within approximately one hundred yards of my residential property.

Unfortunately all the noise from the open 1st floor terrace at the rear of Terrace C is funnelled down Pye Road by the flats on the corner of this road. This directly impacts on my property and that of my adjoining neighbour at 4 Downham Road South.

In the past the levels of noise have been so great from live music and late night revellers at this bar that the police have attended the premises.

Mr Zorn, Pollution Noise Control Officer of Wirral Borough Council, wrote to the applicant with a noise abatement notice on 15.11.06 as a direct result of police confirmation of the facts from the night of 30.10.06.

The noise levels reduced for a few weeks but gradually increased again over the following period until I complained again to Mr Zorn on 10.08.07. The noise was so great that sleeping until after 12.30 was impossible unless all double glazed windows were shut.

Mr Zorn attended my property on 7.09.07 and monitored the noise from Terrace C at that time.

At 10.40 pm the noise level was below that of a statutory nuisance, reaching 42.9 DB by 11.20 pm

At 11.45 pm the noise level reached an LA maximum of 61DB. (Considered to be a statutory nuisance)

Monitoring again took place on 25.09.07 when similar noise levels were taken at the earlier time and stayed the same later at night. Mr Zorn again attended my property on 8.11.07 and spoke with the manager at Terrace C shortly after regarding the high level of noise from their premises. Discussions regarding some form of sound proofing screens were brought up.

The noise levels were kept semi acceptable again for a couple of months then started rising again.

This reached a peak on a Sunday night when even a conversation outside my house was impossible due to the noise. I went to Terrace C at 11.30 pm and told the bar staff to ask the manager, who could not be found at this time, to close the doors onto the outside terrace, turn the music down and quieten the revellers on the outside terrace.

I again spoke with Mr Zorn on 11.08.08 regarding the noise on this occasion. He spoke with the manager of the applicants premises on 12.08.08, again advising the need to lessen noise levels at night. Mr Zorn advised me to monitor sound levels. Since this time the noise has not decreased by any great margin and I now just go to bed much later or sleep with all windows shut. Surely this cannot be acceptable.

The terrace at Terrace C has roof screens and fabric part side screens. It would appear that the roof screens are pulled over the outside terrace area when inclement weather such as wind or rain etc. but the side screens are left folded in the closed position leaving the sides of the terrace open, possibly to appease the no smoking legislation requirements regarding enclosed areas. When the side screens are in their sound proofing position there is a slight reduction in noise levels at my property.

Of all the licensed premises including restaurants, bars and public houses in the vicinity of my property it is only Terrace C that causes night time disturbance regarding noise etc. both during opening hours and also when the revellers leave the premises.

I feel that to vary the opening and alcohol licence in conjunction with the music licence will only increase the noise and disturbance level at my property.

If on renewal of any licence at Terrace C the provision of extra side screen sound proofing could be enforced as a condition of licensing this would be greatly appreciated.

Any extension or variation of hours would encourage more smokers who attend the applicants premises later at night when other (and non smoking) bars close as this is the only bar with outside roofing locally. This would only add to the numbers on the open area of the terrace creating yet more noise.

My family have lived at this address since 1964 and have little objection to development and changes on the high street of Heswall, in fact the addition of restaurants etc. has added to the diversity of the town, but Terrace C has created an ongoing noise problem which unfortunately is so haphazard in its levels and timing that it seems to be very difficult for the relevant authorities to deal with.

I sincerely trust and hope the licensing authority can bring its weight to bear in this matter and oppose the variation of licence and view the contents of this letter when renewal of licence is due.

I refer to the above and would very much like to object to the variation of the licence for the reasons contained below:-

I am resident as can be seen from my address with a family, the premises the subject of the application is within 100 yards of my property and is within a residential area.

When Terrace C first opened it was a quiet Restaurant entertaining middle class people, however, over the past years it has become a bar/nightclub for the far younger generation.

The music from the premises is played loud and late and can be heard from my property disturbing my family.

The premises has the benefit of an "open roof" (side\roof material canopies which are used periodically) which is to the side of the premises backing onto Pye Road with seating, tables, patio heaters and more to the point SPEAKERS!

I cannot understand if this section of the premises is for drinking, entertaining or for the use of smokers as it is neither a confined space nor open.

I myself have on numerous occasions have attended the premises to ask the DPS\Licensee to turn down the volume of their music. The music is not only loud but is sometimes played into the early hours of the morning.

Before today I have telephoned the Police regarding the noise and even the person who took my call could hear the music.

I believe that my next-door neighbour has had dealings with Pollution Noise Control at Wirral Borough Council and has had the noise monitored over a period of time.

There are very many public houses/restaurants within Heswall, however, Terrace C seems to be the only one that brings noise and music to excess level.

I believe if a Variation is granted to these premises then the noise would increase and disturb the neighbourhood even more and maybe attract underage drinking.

I sincerely hope that the point raised in this letter are indeed adhered to.





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
