## CONTRACT EXTENSIONS FOR HIGHWAY VERGE AND TREE MAINTENANCE **CONTRACTS**

#### 1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 This report requests the granting of time extensions on two contracts that contribute to the maintenance of the highway infrastructure.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 Technical Services currently has two contracts with suppliers covering maintenance of the highway verges and trees. The details are as follows:

#### Contract 1

Continental Landscapes Ltd Contractor:

1<sup>st</sup> April 2003 Start Date:

Five years plus option to extend yearly for 5 years (last end date Period:

31<sup>st</sup> March 2013)

Highway verges, shrub beds and some areas of public open Covers:

Value: £1.14m / annum

#### Contract 2

Amenity Tree Care Ltd Contractor:

Start Date: 1<sup>st</sup> April 2008

Two years plus option to extend yearly for a further two years (last end date 31<sup>st</sup> December 2012) Period:

Covers: Tree pruning, felling, surveying

Value: £217,000 / annum

- 2.2 The Regeneration Department is presently reviewing its Parks and Countryside Services provision. As part of the review, these two Technical Services Contracts are also to be included in the process.
- 2.3 Currently in its early stages the Parks and Countryside Services review timetable suggests that any new service provision is unlikely to commence before 1<sup>s</sup> December 2011.
- 2.4 In order to give flexibility to the decision making process for Parks and Countryside Services Delivery, it is considered appropriate that the two existing contract periods are extended initially to this date.
- 2.5 It is thought that both contractors are willing to continue to operate their contracts under the existing terms and conditions.
- These extensions have also been discussed and approved by the Corporate 2.6 Procurement Unit.
