1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the grant of a Betting Premises Licence under the provisions of the Gambling Act 2005.

2.0 RELEVANT BACKGROUND

- 2.1 In considering an application for a Betting Premises Licence the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may either grant it or reject it. Where a licence is granted the Sub-Committee may attach conditions to the licence and/or exclude a condition that would otherwise be attached to the licence by virtue of section 168 of the Gambling Act 2005. A copy of these conditions are available together with the mandatory conditions applicable to Betting Premises Licences under the Gambling Act 2005.
- 2.2 If a Betting Premises Licence is granted the licence authorises the holder to make up to four gaming machines, each of which must be of Category B, C or D, available for use. Regulations state that category B machines at betting premises are restricted to subcategory B2, B3 and B4 machines. Details of the list of categories are available for Members information which provides details of the stake limits and prize limits.
- 2.3 These premises are currently split into two premises and both have the benefit of an Adult Gaming Centre Premises Licence.

3.0 APPLICATION

3.1 An application has been received from Peter Cowap for the grant of a Betting Premises Licence. The application and a plan of the premises is available for Members information which details the proposed area for the Betting Premises Licence. If this application is granted the Adult Gaming Centre Premises Licence which is to be replaced by the Betting Premises Licence will have to be surrendered.

4.0 **RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS**

- 4.1 Representations must be made in accordance with the following Licensing Objectives of the Gambling Act 2005:
 - Preventing gambling from being a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime or disorder, or being used to support crime.
 - Ensuring that gambling is conducted in a fair and open way.
 - Protecting children and other vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.

4.2 Interested Party

A person is an interested party in relation to a premises licence or in relation to an application for or in respect of a premises licence if, in the opinion of the licensing authority:

- (a) lives sufficiently close to the premises to be likely to be affected by the authorised activities.
- (b) has business interests that might be affected by the authorised activities
- 4.3 In respect of this application two representations have been received from Local Residents which relate to one or more of the above Licensing Objectives. A representation has also been received from Oasis Amusements Limited who have business interests that might be affected by the application. Copies of the representations are available.
