

Betting Shop - Premises Licence Conditions

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. The conditions specified below shall be attached to every Premises Licence
 - The summary of the terms and conditions of the premises licence issued under section 164(1)(c) of the 2005 Act shall be displayed in a prominent place within the premises.
 - · The layout of the premises shall be maintained in accordance with the plan.
 - The premises shall not be used for—

 (a) the sale of tickets in a private lottery or customer lottery, or
 (b) the sale of tickets in any other lottery in respect of which the sale of tickets on the premises is otherwise prohibited^(a).
- 2. The conditions specified below shall be attached to every Belting Premises Licences (other than Track Premises Licences)
 - A notice stating that no person under the age of 18 years is permitted to enter the
 premises shall be displayed in a prominent place at every entrance to the premises.
 - Access to the premises shall be from a street or from other premises with a betting premises licence.
 - Wilhout prejudice to sub-paragraph (1), there shall be no means of direct access between the premises and other premises used for the retail sale of merchandise or services.
 - Subject to anything permitted by virtue of the 2005 Act, or done in accordance with the paragraphs below, the premises shall not be used for any purpose other than for providing facilities for betting.
 - Any ATM made available for use on the premises shall be located in a place that
 requires any customer who wishes to use it to leave any gaming machine or belling
 machine in order to do so.
 - No apparatus for making information or other material available in the form of sounds or visual images may be used on the premises, except for apparatus used for the following purposes—
 - (a) communicating information about, or coverage of, sporting events, including—
 (i) information relating to betting on such an event; and

⁽a) See the National Lettery Regulations 1994 (S.I. 1994/189) which prohibits the sale of National Lettery tickets in specified premises licensed for gambling activities.

- (ii) any other matter or information, including an advertisement, which is incidental to such an event:
- (b) communicating information relating to betting on any event (including the result of the event) in connection with which betting transactions may be or have been effected on the premises.
- No publications, other than racing periodicals or specialist betting publications, may be sold or offered for sale on the premises.
- No music, dancing or other entertainment shall be provided or permitted on the premises, save for entertainment provided in accordance with paragraph 5.
- (1)No alcohol shall be permitted to be consumed on the premises at any time during which facilities for gambling are being provided on the premises.
 (2) A notice stating the condition in sub-paragraph (1) shall be displayed in a prominent place at every entrance to the premises.
- A notice setting out the terms on which customers are invited to bet on the premises shall be displayed in a prominent place on the premises to which customers have unrestricted access.

3. Default conditions attached to Betting Premises Licences (other than in respect of tracks)

- No facilities for gambling shall be provided on the premises between the hours of 10pm on one day and 7am on the next day.
- 4. The following are legal requirements of the Gambling Act 2005

Door Supervision:

- (1) Where a condition for door supervision is attached to a premises licence subsection (3) shall apply in relation to the licence.
- (2) In subsection (1) "condition for door supervision" means a condition requiring that one or more persons be responsible for guarding the premises against unauthorised access or occupation, against outbreaks or disorder or against damage.
- (3) If the person carrying out the guarding mentioned in subsection (2) is required by the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) to hold a licence under that Act authorising the guarding, the requirements under that Act shall be treated for the purpose of this Act as if it were a condition of the premises licence attached by virtue of this section.

Christmas Day:

A premises licence shall, by virtue of this section, be subject to the condition that the premises shall not be used to provide facilities for gambling on Christmas Day.

Annual Fee:

- (1) The holder of a premises licence-
 - Shall pay a first annual fee to the licensing authority within such period after the issue of the licence as may be prescribed, and
 - Shall pay an annual fee to the licensing authority before each anniversary of the Issue of the licence.

Availability of licence:


- (1) The holder of a premises licence shall
 - a. Keep the licence on the premises, and
 - b. Arrange for the Ilcence to be made available on request to-
 - I. A constable
 - II. An enforcement officer, or
 - III. An authorised local authority officer.

Change of circumstance:

- (1) If the holder of a premises licence ceases to reside or attend at the address specified in the licence under section 151(1)(b) he shall as soon as is reasonably practicable
 - a. Notify the licensing authority, and
 - Inform the licensing authority of a home or business address at which he resides or attends.
- (2) The Secretary of State may make regulations requiring the holder of a premises licence
 - a. To notify the licensing authority of any change of circumstances of a prescribed kind in relation to him or to an authorised activity, and
 - b. To give the licensing authority prescribed details of the change.

Ref : Application for Betting Shop License at 11 Milton Pavement, Birkenhead

I wish to object to the above on various grounds, however the application does not have much detail and therefore my objections may be somewhat general and make some assumptions.

If possible, with the chairman's approval, I would ask that I am allowed to attend the committee meeting and object in person.

As you are no doubt aware, there is currently a consultation document following on from the guidelines issued by the Gambling Commission which has implications with regard to this type of application and the DCMS and Local Government are party to this consultation.see attached.

I would ask that my objections may be modified to reflect any possible changes in the guidelines in due course.

I list below some of my grounds:

1/ Betting shops and amusement centres are not in the same planning class and therefore the premises needs planning permission as a stand alone betting shop I understand no application has been submitted for planning permission, which is normally sought prior to the license application.

2/ When the applicant applied for his initial arcade license an approval letter from the landlords agent was submitted as part of the application. No approval letter for betting shop usage has been submitted in this instance.

3/ I understand the guidelines for a betting shop ask for a distinct separate entrance from the public pathway and in this instance I cannot see how an entrance from a private foyer meets this requirement.





4/ The application is for a betting shop license where horse race betting etc is the prime use ,however very little detail is given as to how this is achieved. The facilities and the size are very restricted and no provision is made for tollets whatsoever especially for disabled customers. The plans do not appear to offer all that is required for an independent free standing business.

5/ Trading hours are requested for up to 10pm for the betting shop and in the original submission for the arcade license a closing time of 6.30pm was agreed by the applicant with the committee .Does the applicant intend to trade the two premises separately as he is supposed to and is the betting shop capable of trading as a stand alone entity with its small size and lack of facilities. Will the betting shop be capable of trading when the arcade is closed.

6/ As you are aware a betting Ilcense allows for 4 FOBT machines which are not allowed in AGC's and are generally agreed to provide a better return for the operator. Despite the very small area of the proposed betting shop the applicant still shows 4 FOBT machines as part of the plan and to me that indicates the prime intended usage are the FOBT's not normal betting ,especially as there is a betting shop next door. The plans currently show general betting facilities but plans can be changed. Indeed the applicants original plan presented to the committee as part of the arcade application in Aug 06,did not happen and no disabled tollets or indeed any tollets were installed. Eventually the staff tollets on the first floor were made public, Also the frontage was reduced from two external entrances to one

7/I agree I am trade objector, however I am objecting on the grounds that this license creates an unfair advantage by providing FOBTs in what is basically an AGC. As mentioned earlier, this is part of the Gambling Commission consultation exercise and indeed the Minister for Sport expressed only last week his concern that we are in danger of creating gambling sheds on the British high street.

In conclusion, I would ask that you consider rejecting this application, however if the committee are minded to approve this application, I would ask they consider making the license conditional on planning approval being obtained prior to the issue of the license and also that the prime usage of the betting shop remains general horse race betting etc and the ancilliary FOBT machines can only be operated provided the prime use is active.

I would appreciate if you could keep me informed as to the status of this application.
