#### REPORT SUMMARY

This report explains the process of developing and managing the scrutiny work programme for the municipal year. At the meeting of the People Overview & Scrutiny Committee (OSC), held on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2016, the Children Sub Committee was reestablished for the 2016/17 municipal year. The Sub Committee needs to define an annual work programme, which should align with the corporate priorities of the Council, in particular the delivery of the Wirral Plan pledges which are within the remit of the Committee. Clearly the work programme of the Sub Committee should supplement, not duplicate, the work programme of the parent committee, the People OSC.

This report describes the process to enable members to deliver and manage the work programme for the municipal year. This process provides the committee with an opportunity to plan and regularly review its work across the municipal year. The initial list of potential topics includes a number of items highlighted during the previous municipal year. This list can be supplemented by other items which members may want to propose.

Recommendation 16 of that report stated: "Recommendation 16 – Social Care reorganisation: Follow-up investigation by members The Strategic Director of Transformation and Resources is requested to enable scrutiny members to arrange a follow-up session / workshop to evaluate the effectiveness of the re-organisation once the new Specialist services social care teams are embedded. The review, which will include front-line staff and possibly parents and families, will also monitor the success of the plans to achieve improved retention of staff".
Complaints report for Children's Services	Report	This report is provided on an annual basis and is scheduled for the December 2016 meeting.
Special Guardianship Orders	Report	Further to a recommendation made in the Safeguarding Children Scrutiny Report, the Sub-Committee received a report on Special Guardianship Orders (SGOs) in March 2016. The Director informed the meeting that further work would take place regarding the use of SGOs and a further report would be provided to the Sub Committee.
