Executive Summary

Please note all results are provisional at the time of writing the report (August 2018) Early Years

The number of children achieving a good level of development (GLD) has increased by 1.1% to 70.5%.

Slightly more boys attained GLD (an increase of 0.2%). In contrast the number of girls attaining GLD increased by 2.2% so the gender gap widened from 13.7% to 16.2%.

The percentage of free school meal children (FSM) attaining GLD has increased by 3.9%. In comparison non FSM children's attainment increased by 0.3%. As a result the FSM gap narrowed from 21.4% to 17.8%.

The proportion of both SEN and non SEN children showed an improvement in attainment from last year. SEN children's attainment improved at a greater rate than non SEN children (1.7% compared to 0.4%) As a result the gap narrowed by 1.3%.

A small number, three children with an Education Health and Care Plan, achieved a good level of development. This was an improvement on previous years. The percentage of children with SEN, but without a statement, who attained a good level of development increased. The gap between all pupils and pupils with SEN or an EHCP has narrowed.

More pupils with ASD, a physical disability, SEMH, a specific learning difficulty and speech, language and communication needs attained GLD in 2018.


More pupils with English as an additional language met the standard, an increase of 1.8% to 58.9%. The attainment of pupils with English as their first language increased by 1.1% to 71.0%. The attainment gap narrowed by 0.7% to 12.1%.

The attainment of Non White British children in writing has increased by 1.2%. Compared to white British children fewer of these pupils attain the expected standard. The attainment gap has stayed the same at 3.3%.

More disadvantaged children attained GLD – an increase of 4.8%. In comparison the attainment of non disadvantaged children has slightly decreased by 0.1% at 74.4%. The disadvantage gap narrowed by 4.8% to 17.7%.


Detailed Analysis of GLD Outcomes

The number of children attaining a Good Level of Development (GLD) has increased by 1.1%. All localities increased the proportion of children attaining GLD and Birkenhead saw the greatest increase of 3.3%.









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




White British







The percentage of boys attaining GLD has decreased slightly (by 0.2%). In comparison girls' attainment increased by 2.2%. As a result, the gender gap widened from 13.7% to 16.2%. As a result of the increased girls' attainment the gender gap increased in both Birkenhead and West Wirral by 2.9% to 18.4% and 7.3% to 17.9% respectively. Boys attainment in Birkenhead (57.9%) is the lowest when compared to all localities and Birkenhead has the widest gender gap.



The proportion of free school meal children (FSM) attaining GLD has increased by 3.9%. In comparison non FSM children's attainment increased by 0.3%. As a result, the FSM gap narrowed from 21.4% to 17.8%. In Birkenhead, Wallasey and West Wirral South the proportion of FSM pupils attaining a GLD increased (by 3.3%, 7.3% and 3.2% respectively). South Wirral locality has the greatest FSM gap of 23.7% and was the only locality whose gap has widened (by 6.4%)



The proportion of both SEN and non SEN children showed an improvement in attainment from last year. SEN children's attainment improved at a greater rate than non SEN children (1.7% compared to 0.4%) As a result the gap narrowed by 1.3%. The percentage of SEN pupils attaining a GLD improved in Birkenhead, Wallasey and West Wirral (by 2.2%, 1.7% and 3.6% respectively) West Wirral narrowed the gap by 4.2% but still has the greatest SEN gap by 68.3%.



More pupils with English as an additional language met the standard, an increase of 1.8% to 58.9%. The attainment of pupils with English as their first language increased by 1.1% to 71.0%. The attainment gap narrowed by 0.7% to 12.1%. Birkenhead locality saw an increase in the attainment of EAL pupils by 11.4% to 60% and narrowed the gap by 7.2% to 8.8%. All other localities saw a decrease in the percentage of EAL pupils achieving a GLD and as a result, a widening of the EAL gap to 16.8%, 12.6% and 14.3% in Wallasey, West Wirral and South Wirral respectively.

More disadvantaged children attained GLD – an increase of 4.8%. In comparison the attainment of non disadvantaged children has slightly decreased by 0.1% at 74.4%. The disadvantage gap narrowed by 4.8% to 17.7%.

The proportion of disadvantaged children in Birkenhead, Wallasey and South Wirral attaining a GLD increased by 4%, 8.3% and 3.6% respectively so narrowing the gap to 14.1%, 14.5% and 22.8% respectively. Wallasey closed the gap by 10.4%. South Wirral saw a decline in the attainment of disadvantaged pupils by 2.6% and the gap widened by 3.1% to 25.3%. South Wirral locality has the widest disadvantaged gap.
