### PRIORITY 2: Help me make my daily life better

We all want children and young people to thrive and enjoy their day-to-day lives. Childhood should be a time for fun, development, learning, new experiences and love. We all have the ability to improve the daily-lived experience of children- inside and outside of their family home. A day living with worry, uncertainty, an empty tummy or in an unhappy home is a long-time for a child and experiencing that day after day will lead to poor wellbeing and poor outcomes.

It is important that we recognise how parents and adults affect the daily-lived experience of the child. Living in a home where the parents experience the toxic trio (domestic abuse, substance misuse and parental mental health) have a huge impact on the quality of the child's daily life and it is therefore essential that we all take a whole-family approach.
