Claimant Count (Source ONS July 2020)

Wirral now has 12,900 claimants a decrease of 275 this month, the claimant rate is now 6.7% of the working-age population

Nearly all wards have seen a decrease or no change this month, but our largest concentrations remain in our most deprived areas with rates reaching nearly 15% in some wards;

The 18-24 age group is the only age group to see an increase this month; highlighting that they are being disproportionately affected by the impact of covid;








Reduction in mileage from March to June 2020





Recent work has been done to RAG rate each case within social care and visiting and contact timescales have been changed to reflect their RAG rating. Children who are rated red are contacted/visited on a weekly basis. Children rated amber are visited within every 4 weeks and contacted within every two weeks. Green rated are visited within 6 weeks and contacted within every 3 weeks.

Children who have not been contacted will be those children who are very stable, for example, we have children with disabilities who are receiving ongoing support and do not require regular contact. We also have some children who are not able to be contacted, for example children in a youth justice setting.


