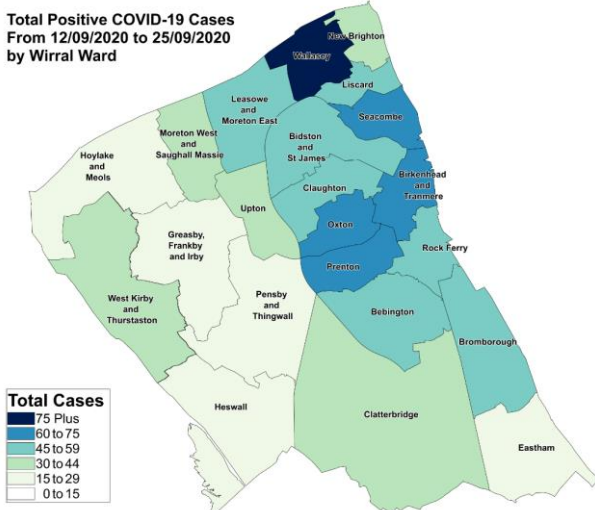

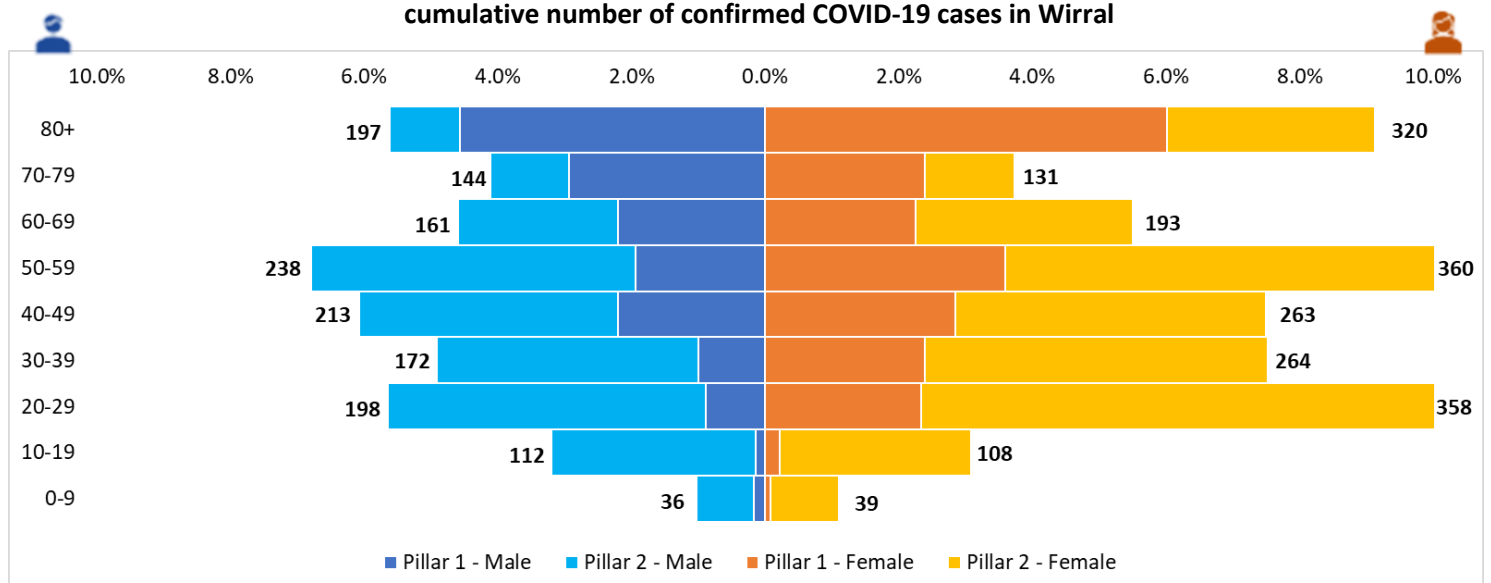

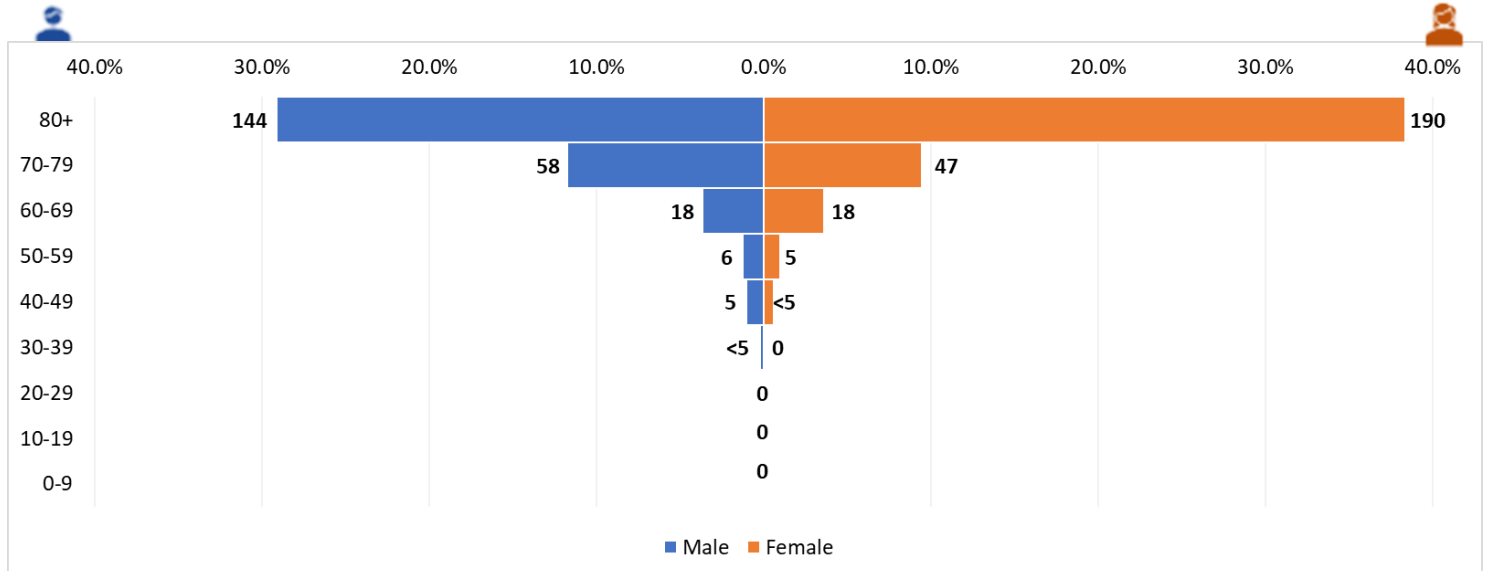

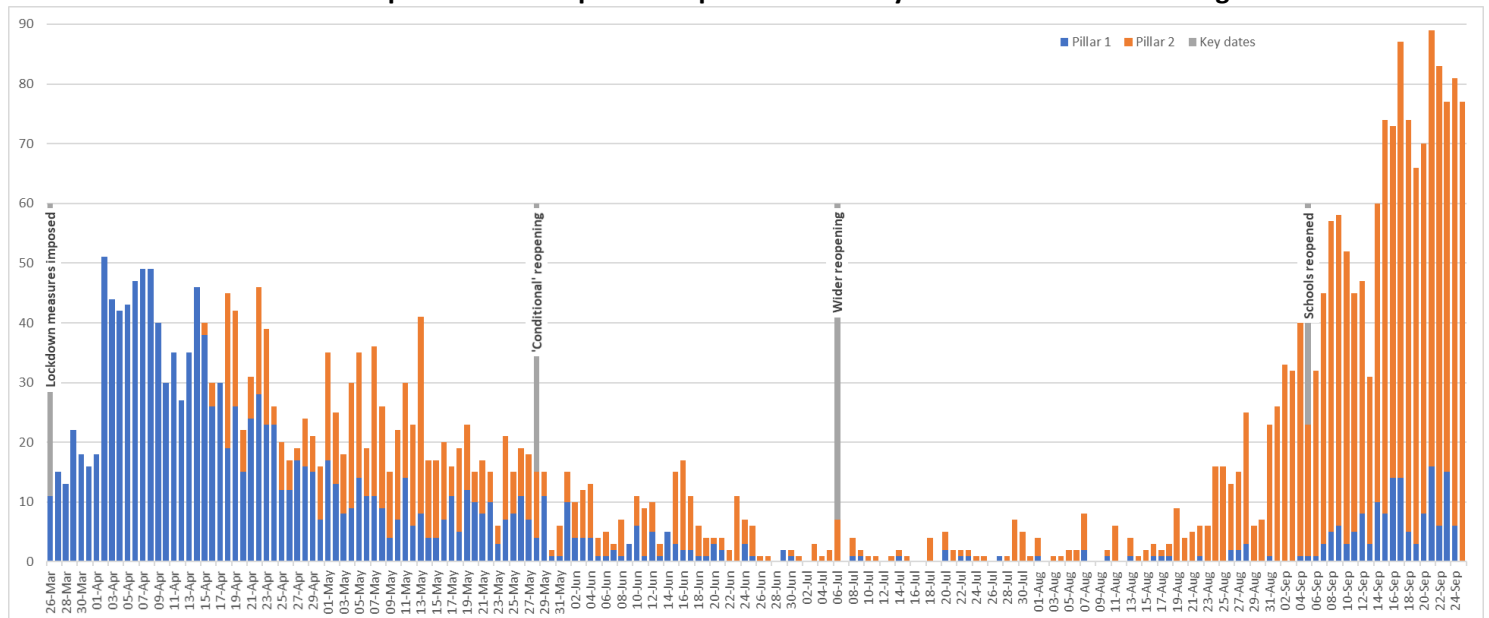

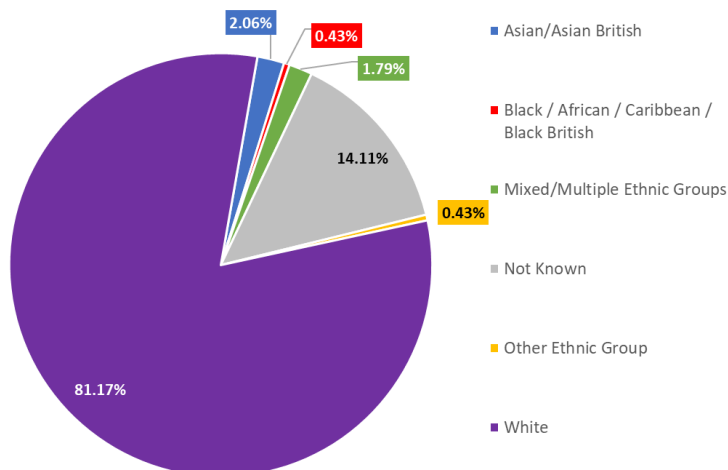
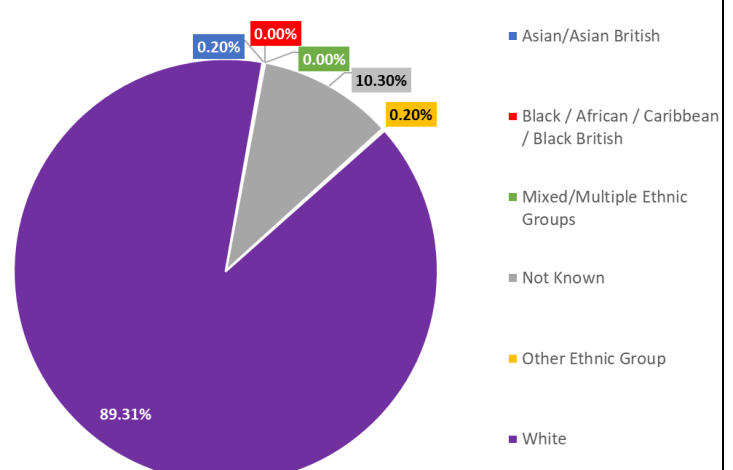
cumulative number of COVID-19 related deaths in Wirral
