REPORT OF THE DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE/DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE SERVICES

COMMUNITY INITIATIVES FUND- RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUNDING FROM AREA FORUMS ASSESSMENT PANELS

1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is:
 - to inform Cabinet of the proposals received from voluntary and community sector organisations for funding from the Community Initiatives Fund (CIF);
 - to inform Cabinet of the recommendations of the area forum CIF assessment panels that met in July 2007
 - To agree to advertise remaining funds in September 2007 and for those forums that are not re-advertising to carry forward any remaining amounts to 2008/09 as identified at 11.2 of this report.
 - To note that there are draft area forum operating protocols available that look at the area forum funding process.
- 1.2 Cabinet is asked to consider the recommendations of the area forum assessment panels, agree to fund applications at the levels identified within the appendices of this report.

2. Background – Area Forum Grant Programmes 2007/08

2.1 As Members will be aware, the Community Initiative Fund (CIF) is a small grants programme, administered by area forums, to support the development of local projects and initiatives. Since 2001 CIF has supported 410 groups to access funding totalling £668,997.45. In addition to CIF, Cabinet also agreed to provide area forums with additional funding from Community Safety Fund to support local projects that would contribute to improved community safety and in recognition of the growing success of the area forum grants programme, a further source of funding was secured through Local Agenda 21, to allow area forums to support the development of environmental projects.

Listed below is a summary of the funding and allocations received by the Council's 11 area forums in 2007/08:

- Community Initiative Fund £11,000
- Community Safety Fund £3,000
- ◆ LA21 Fund £1,500
- 2.2 All applications were assessed by a panel (membership decided and approved by each of the area forums) against agreed and publicised criteria, and in making their recommendations the panels referred to any local priorities set by their particular area forum.

3. Applications to Area Forums

3.1 The availability of the funding was publicised widely, including an advertisement in the Wirral Globe, publicity leaflets at information points including leisure centres, One Stop Shops and libraries etc across all of the wards and through the area forums.
