## REPORT OF THE DEPUTY CHIEF EXECUTIVE/DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE SERVICES

## APPEALS SUB-COMMITTEE

## 1. Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to enable the Committee to appoint an Appeals Sub-Committee. The law requires that Committees appoint their own SubCommittees. It is for the Committee to decide how many members should be appointed to the Sub-Committee subject to the statutory rules on proportionality (see Para 3). The Committee may also appoint a Chair and Vice-Chair of the Sub-Committee.

Unless appointed as full members, the Leaders and Deputy Leaders of the three largest political groups represented on the Council are entitled to attend meetings of all Sub-Committees, with the right to speak at the invitation of the Chair (Standing Order 25(4)).

## 2. Functions

The Sub-Committee's terms of reference, as set out in the Council's constitution, are:
(a) To hear and determine appeals in connection with gradings or grievances or against disciplinary action or dismissal of employees.
(b) To receive and consider reports from a designated independent person investigating allegations of misconduct against the Council's Head of Paid Service, the Monitoring Officer or Chief Finance Officer, and to act as the dismissing committee.
(c) To investigate and take disciplinary action in respect of the misconduct of Chief Officers and Deputies (subject to a right of appeal to the Employment and Appointments Committee.

The Sub-Committee met eight times in 2006/07.
