1.0 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Sunday to Thursday 7.00am to 1.30am Friday and Saturday 7.00am to 2.00am

Christmas Eve and Boxing Day until 2.30am

An additional hour was granted on the morning of the day the clocks go forward (in order to negate the effect of the change from British Summer Time to Greenwich Meantime).

Late Night Refreshment:

Sunday to Thursday 11.00pm to 12.30am Friday and Saturday 11.00pm to 1.00am

Christmas Eve and Boxing Day until 2.00am

An additional hour has been granted to all finishing times on the following days:

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Burns Night 25 January Australia Day 26 January St David's Day 1 March St Patrick's Day 17 March St George's Day 23 April St Andrew's Day 30 November An additional 30 minutes has been granted to all finishing times on the following days:

Thursday immediately preceding Good Friday Sunday immediately preceding a Bank Holiday Monday

2.2 Conditions currently imposed on the Premises Licence are available.

3.0 **APPLICATION**

3.1 This application is a request to remove a condition currently attached to the Premises Licence as follows:

'Beer garden to close at 6.00pm'

The following condition is proposed by the applicant:

'There will be no consumption of alcohol or soft drinks or licensable activities permitted in the beer garden after 7.00pm'

- 3.3 This application was listed to be considered by the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee on 14 June 2007 but was requested to be adjourned by the applicant. This request to adjourn the application was due to a witness being unable to attend the meeting.
