 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence (permanently or for a temporary period of up to 3 months).
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor (if applicable).

- Suspend the Licence for a period not more than 3 months.
- Revoke the Licence.

An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the Bar Cuba, 6 Market Street, Hoylake. The Licensing Sergeant has advised that the grounds for review are in relation to crime and disorder, public nuisance and protection of children from harm
