GREEN

 That is right because sixteen year old people should pay an adult fare and security is good and they should have more CCTV cameras.

AMBER

- Didn't tell them much good news.
- Claremount: More students are now over 16. They should have subsidised fares.
- Not good at all.
- Questions were not answered thoroughly enough on disability facilities at train stations and the aesthetical appearance of train stations was not answered and is poor.
- Railway stations/bus shelters are dirty and vandalised.
- Too expensive
- I think the cost of transport for 16 year olds and under 16 year old is too
 expensive. More people would use public transport if it was cheaper for an under
 16 year old. It costs £1.10 to get to Liverpool, it was 70p. Children under 16 can't
 get jobs so paying for this can be difficult, also some buses are cheaper than
 others when all should be the same.
- Transport need to address fares!

RED

- Bus passes for school students are much too expensive for students.
- How do railway stations get picked to be upgraded?
- Who makes the decision?
- Prices too expensive. If prices reduced, then more people will use public transport which means less cars. This makes less pollution etc.
- Too many buses run the same route, too often e.g. 410.
- If you have to pay adult fares at 16, how come you're not allowed to vote until you're 18?

TECHNICAL SERVICES

GREEN (3)

AMBER

COMMUNITY SAFETY

GREEN

- Less police but more community support officers. More security officers on trains and more posters stopping children messing about.

- Need to address security at railways.
- Very well answered.

AMBER

- I don't think they are putting enough detail in to all of them.

- They need to go in depth in all of them not just a few
- They skip out on the detail and only half answer our concerns.

RED

- Safe places to drink 18+.
- Policing & Community Safety. Adults still treated with more respect than children. Adults still think of teenagers as rebels, trouble - makers- not understood.
- Policing:
- When young people are moved on, they have nowhere to go, so they cannot go but – more places to go.
- Railway stations and bus shelters are vandalised, ruined and dangerous to members of the public, not just youths.

- Advertising still not enough.

RED

 I haven't heard of any of these outside of the Youth Parliament/Voice Conference.

HOUSING

AMBER

- Support for people who are forced out of school by parents after GCSE's.
- Clean, secure youth hostels.
- More services for kids who are trying to give up smoking or alcohol abuse.
- University/College support Fees should be lower.

- Appalling lack of consideration for the homeless and vulnerable young people. Human life, safety and well-being is of greater value than bus helters.
- There must be a meeting with young people and Housing.
- Should have lots of meetings with homeless young people, not just young people. Talk with Response and children/teenagers from Forum Housing. Support needed.

CULTURE & LEISURE

GREEN

- Skate Parks.
- Improved lighting.
- Activity days in schools, WKGS. Pensby etc. gives younger children a chance to use proper science equipment.
- They have made parks safer for younger people.

AMBER

- Recording studios + Leisure discount for 16's and under.
- Overcrowded swimming
- No proposals for other activities
- More evening activities
- Under 16's only.
- More discounts for under 16's.
- I still find young people are being moved on from Parks although the lighting situation has improved as has the litter in parks.
- Have not answered question about cost of leisure facilities simply answered saying free swims. These free swims are good but more things have to be done!
- They didn't say any improvements
- Claremount: any age, any time
- Most swimming pools have certain time slots for young people or families to swim what happened to the public bathing.

- Too many rises in price
- If you charge young people Adult prices, why can't we legally not drink or gamble.
 - Nowhere for children to 'hang' out and chat!
 - More health-promoting activities during holiday's for all ages.
 - No culture perhaps introduce different cultures in meeting with children at a young age.
 - Lack of park rangers and no evidence that there ever will be.
 - No Apparent Priorities
 - Lesser issues being tackled first, such as discounted leisure facilities rather than the more important issues such as more lighting in public places which ensures safety.
 - Nowhere to go ice skating too far away. Limited swimming areas, Cinema prices too high, Limited bridle ways for horse-riders.
 - No lighting in Bebington Park at all

- More work to be done.
- Questions are answered, but not in depth, what will the real outcome be?
- Curriculum in PSHE should become compulsory, as schools are allowed to skip over "risky" subjects.
- Haven't agreed with them they just told them that they couldn't do anything.
- PSHE
- Newer videos
- Better teaching
- More interactive lessons
- More visitors from outside school.

PLACES TO GO + THINGS TO DO

GREEN

- Bowling and laser guest on New Brighton Prom. Swimming is cheap for children.
 Range of activities for all ages.
- They have answered all questions.
- We were awarded £18,500 to improve our park.

AMBER

- There aren't any band performance places on Pensby, but there is a Youth Centre by the park that isn't really used often. Why don't we turn it into a band venue? There are a lot of budding bands around!
- Media Arts College is here, but we are not allowed to use it.

- I think that there needs to be more things for young people to do, there isn't enough sports facilities or youth clubs or shelters. There's nothing for young people to do at a weekend as things are becoming more expensive for kids so free youth clubs making a safe, fun places for kids to spend their weekends.
- The youth shelters don't work as they attract yobs and homeless people. Park should be locked after a certain time.
- Certain areas have managed to achieve and resolve the things for "PLACES TO GO AND THINGS TO DO!" but if there is nowhere for Wirral bands to record.... Why?
- Older children making younger children feel threatened by overtaking skate parks and shopping centres. Queues too long at swimming baths, although the free swim sessions get children off the streets.
- I don't think the question has been answered properly because nothing has changed.
- Answers are a bit vague.
- We would like to be more aware of what clubs and youth clubs are available by way of a booklet or web-site maybe.

- EMA: Means testing undermines YP from higher earning families, disempowering them.
- Wider range of activities and teams for both genders. More places to go on wet days and in summer holidays. Skate parks over-run by older people.
- Cuts out YP for higher earning families.
- More places to go and take part in activities.
- No visible youth shelters.
- Leisure facilities are too expensive, especially at cinemas
- Another ice-rink is <u>desperately</u> needed as Queensferry Ice rink is expensive, too busy and it is the nearest ice rink for miles.
