REPORT SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for the Licensing Act Sub-Committee to consider an application to vary a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by **Brunning and Price Limited** and relates to the premises known as **The Red Fox, Neston Road, Thornton Hough, CH64 7TL**.

- 4.1 The application is to increase the licensed area to include the outside gardens in the Premises Licence. The applicant has also applied to remove all the conditions contained in Annexe 2 of the Premises Licence and replace them with the conditions set out within the Operating Schedule of the application.
- 4.2 Applicants are required to submit as part of their application an Operating Schedule that sets out how they will conduct/manage their business to promote the four Licensing Objectives.
- 4.3 Members of the Licensing Act Sub-Committee are advised that the proposals set out in the Operating Schedule may become conditions of the licence should the application to vary the Premises Licence be granted.
- 4.4 A copy of the application, proposed plan and current Premises Licence is available.

7.1 Section 18(3) of The Licensing Act 2003 provides that where relevant representations are made, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and having regard to the representations, take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7.2 Section 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the Licensing Authority must carry out its functions under this Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:

- (a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
- (b) public safety;
- (c) the prevention of public nuisance; and
- (d) the protection of children from harm

and that in carrying out its licensing functions the Licensing Authority must have regard to its Licensing Statement of Policy published under section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, and any Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
