1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the review of a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by Merseyside Police and relates to the premises known as **The Corner Store, 104 Woodchurch Lane, Prenton.**

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may, having regard to the application for review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
- Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
- Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
- Revoke the Licence.

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

3.0 APPLICATION

3.1 An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as The Corner Store. The Licensing Sergeant has advised that the grounds for review are in relation to the Premises being linked to criminal activity, namely a number illegal immigrants being employed at the premises.
