1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the review of a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by Merseyside Police and relates to the premises known as **Mount Pleasant Stores, 34 Mount Pleasant Road, New Brighton.**

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 Mount Pleasant Stores currently has a Premises Licence, to allow the following Licensable Activity:

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Monday to Saturday 08:00 to 23:00
Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Good Friday 08:00 to 22:30
Christmas Day 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30

2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may, having regard to the application for review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
- Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
- Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
- Revoke the Licence.

The licensing authority may decide that no action is appropriate if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

3.0 APPLICATION

- 3.1 An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as Mount Pleasant Stores. Merseyside Police have advised that the grounds for review are in relation to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder due to the Premises Licence Holder, who is also the Designated Premises Supervisor, being arrested on suspicion of theft.
- 3.2 Further information to support the above grounds for review is included within the application which is available.

Seven representations have been received by local residents who are concerned that the application from Merseyside Police to Review the Licence may result in the Licence being revoked.
