1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Merseyside Police have concerns that if the application is granted that anti-social behaviour will increase. Furthermore, Merseyside Police consider that the Operating Schedule detailed within the application does not sufficiently demonstrate how crime and disorder will be prevented at these premises in the future.
