1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider an application to vary a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by **Chambers (Wirral) Limited** and relates to the premises known as **Chambers, 1-5 The Mount, Heswall**.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 These premises currently have a Premises Licence with the following hours:

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 23:30

Hours Open to the Public

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00

Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance, Exhibition of Films and Indoor Sporting Events

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 23:30

Late Night Refreshment

Sunday to Saturday 23:00 to 23:30

3.0 APPLICATION

3.1 The application to vary the Premises Licence is to remove the following conditions from the Premises Licence:

- Staff must be regularly monitored by the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure proper use of the refusal button on the till system by all staff.
- There must be no drinking outside the front of the building at any time.

4.0 PROMOTION OF LICENSING OBJECTIVES

- 4.1 Applicants are required to submit as part of their application an operating schedule that sets out how they will conduct/manage their business in accordance with the four Licensing Objectives. A copy of the full application is available.
- 4.2 Members of the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee are advised that the proposals set out in the operating schedule may become conditions of licence should the application be granted.

Representations have been received from nine local residents. The representations relate to concerns that if the application is granted in respect of the request to remove the restriction on the outside area, this will cause noise nuisance to local residents. Merseyside Police

A representation has been received from Merseyside Police. The representation from Merseyside Police relates to concerns that if the condition relating to the outside area is removed then this will have a negative impact on the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objectives. Merseyside Police also have concerns relating to the request to remove the use of a refusal button on the till system as this will have a negative impact on the protection of children from harm licensing objective.
