1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the grant of a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by **Leonard Henry** and relates to the premises located at **56 Mill Lane, Liscard CH44 5UG**.

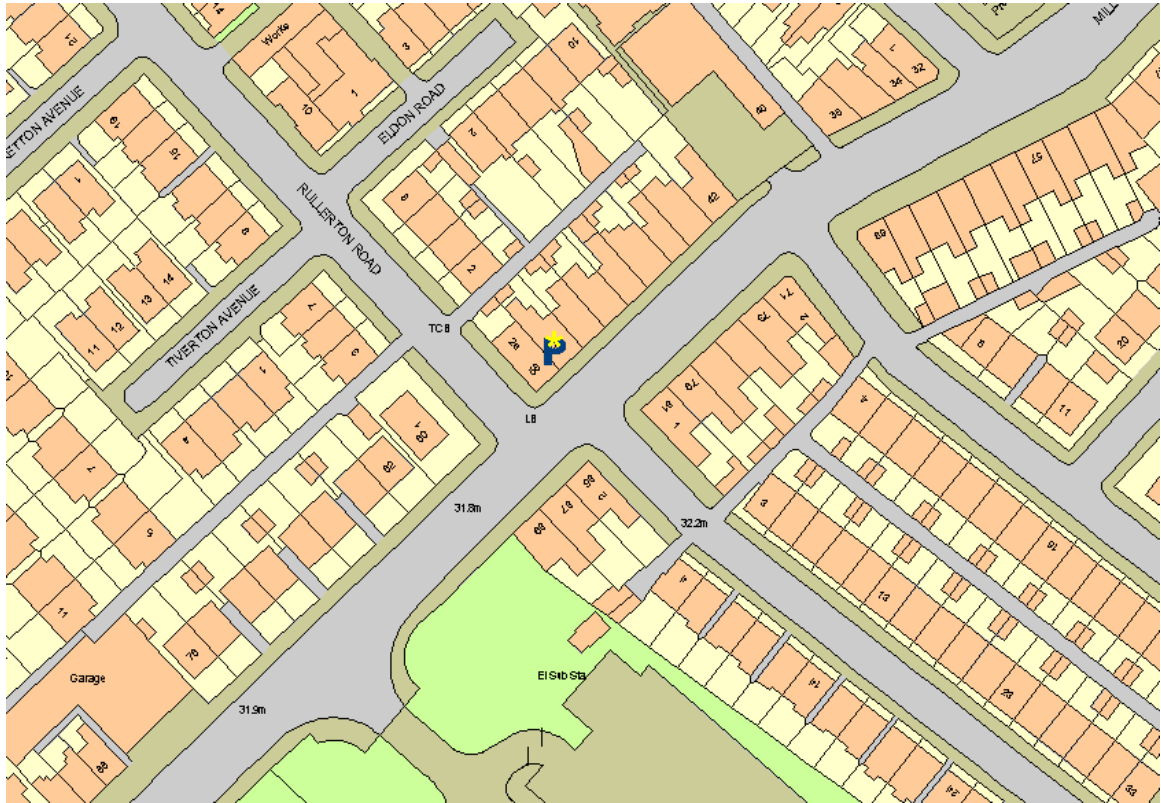
