5 SPECIAL CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY

The Strategic Director of Regeneration and Environment submitted a report to advise Members of the outcome of the public consultation undertaken in response to a request received to amend the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy to include a Special Cumulative Impact Policy for an area of Birkenhead. The report also provided Members with an update from Merseyside Police in respect of this proposal.

The Licensing Manager advised Members that further to the consultation having been circulated to the appropriate bodies in accordance with Section 5(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 and publicised on the Council's website, no comments or evidence had been provided from residents or businesses to support the introduction of a Special Policy. One written response had been received from Brian Kenny who had been a Ward Councillor at the time of the consultation.

Members were advised that Merseyside Police had undertaken a review of their evidence during the consultation and had since given consideration to new initiatives within the Birkenhead area to address anti social behaviour. Members were informed that Merseyside Police had advised that they were not seeking the introduction of a Special Cumulative Impact Policy within the Birkenhead area at the present time but that this would be kept under review.

Sergeant Barrigan attended the meeting. He reported that the Charing Cross area was a high risk location in relation to alcohol related crime and disorder and advised Members that other initiatives had been introduced to target the ongoing issues being suffered by residents and businesses in the area. Sergeant Barrigan referred to the introduction of the Seven Beats Initiative, and advised that the intention was that an overall improvement to quality of life issues experienced in the area would be achieved by adopting a targeted approach with additional resources.

Sergeant Barrigan reported that the size of the area covered by the seven beats was different from the area that had been proposed to be covered by the Special Cumulative Impact Policy and that this area would now be monitored and kept under review. He further advised that it may be the case that should the current initiatives not be effective, the Police would potentially seek a Cumulative Impact Policy to be included within the Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing Policy for the 'seven beats' area at some point in the future.

Sergeant Barrigan referred to the need for the Licensing Objectives to be upheld when considering future applications and stated that Merseyside Police were satisfied at this time that the existing Home Office guidance on Cumulative Impact together with the Licensing Authority's newly revised Statement of Licensing Policy could be used to assess the merits of future applications received.

The Chair and Members of the Committee thanked Sergeant Barrigan for his work. The Chair also gave his thanks to officers and Members of the Licensing Act 2003 Committee for their work in the previous municipal year.

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is for Members to review and approve the licence fees in respect of Premises Licences required under The Gambling Act 2005 with effect from 1 April 2015.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 The Gambling Act 2005 and the Regulations made under this Act prescribe that The Licensing Authority may determine the fees for Premises Licences up to a maximum level set out in the Regulations.

2.2 The maximum Premises Licence fee levels are set out in the table shown in Appendix 1.

2.3 The Gambling Act 2005 states that the Licensing Authority

‘...shall aim to ensure that the income from fees of that kind as nearly as possible equates to the costs of providing the service to which the fee relates...’

2.4 In 2007 the fees were set at 20% below the maximum fees that can be applied to reflect the projected cost of providing the service at that time. These fees, which are the fees currently charged, are set out in the table shown in Appendix 2.

2.5 The Gambling Act 2005 requires the Licensing Authority to ‘...publish the amount of the fee as determined from time to time...’

2.6 A review of the costs of providing services required under The Gambling Act 2005 has been undertaken and it has been identified that the income received from Gambling fees shows a small projected excess over expenditure in the sum of £908.22 for the financial year 2014-2015.

2.7 From January 2015 the licensing function will be subject to at least a 2.2% increase in staffing costs. Members are therefore asked to maintain the current fees for Premises Licences as set out in the Table in Appendix 2.

3.0 RELEVANT RISKS

- 3.1 Fees that do not cover the costs of the administration of the Service can result in a reduction in staffing resources.

4.0 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 4.1 There is no provision for other options to be considered.

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to inform the Licensing Act 2003 Committee of the number of licences issued and varied under the Licensing Act 2003 since 1 April 2014. The Report also provides details of the number of licences that have been surrendered, lapsed or been subject to Review as well as the number of Temporary Event Notices given to the Licensing Authority since 1 April 2014.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 Members are aware that it is the responsibility of the Licensing Authority to administer functions under the Licensing Act 2003 and to promote the following licensing objectives when carrying out its duties:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm

2.2 The four licensing objectives aim to ensure that the carrying on of licensable activities which includes the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment is done in the public interest. When discharging its functions, the Licensing Authority must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

3.0 LICENCES ISSUED

3.1 The table below shows the number of licences issued from 1 April 2014 to 5 March 2015 together with the total number of licences currently in force. The table also shows the number of applications received to vary Licences.

- 3.2 The Premises Licences issued since 1 April 2014 can be found at Appendix 1. Six of the Premises Licences issued were granted to the R & A Championships Limited to facilitate the Open Golf Championship.
- 3.3 A total number of 497 Temporary Event Notices have been given to the Licensing Authority during the period 1 April 2014 to 5 March 2015.
- 3.4 During this financial year commencing 1 April 2014 there have been a total number of 21 applications considered by the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee. These included 15 new Premises Licence applications which were granted, one new Premises Licence which was refused and three variations to Premises Licences which were all granted. This also included an application to Transfer a Premises Licence and an application to change a designated premises supervisor where both applications were refused. A Temporary Event Notice was also listed but was withdrawn during the proceedings and an application for a Personal Licence was refused.
- 3.5 There have been a total number of 30 Premises Licences that have been surrendered or lapsed during the period 1 April 2014 to 5 March 2015. This figure includes the six Premises Licences that lapsed after the Open Golf Championship. These premises can be found at Appendix 2.
- 3.6 There have been two premises which have been subject to review. Details of these reviews are as follows:
