- 3.3 The applicant has also requested that the following conditions amended from:
 - Alcohol must be stored securely in the storeroom that can be locked and not accessible from the Outside.
 - Refresher training must be conducted with staff by the DPS at least every 14 weeks.

to:

• Alcohol stored in the storeroom (which must be lockable) must be kept secure and not directly accessible from the outside.

- Refresher training for staff must be conducted every 12 months by either the DPS, premises licence holder or another person as appointed by the DPS/premises licence holder.
- This application was listed to be considered by the Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee on 21 November 2017, however the matter was adjourned to the date of this Hearing, 11 January 2018.

3.5 PROMOTION OF LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Applicants are required to submit as part of their application an operating schedule that sets out how they will conduct/manage their business to promote the four Licensing Objectives. A copy of the full application is available.
