REPORT SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Members to consider an application to approve a Peugeot 5008 as a Private Hire Vehicle to carry six passengers.

RECOMMENDATION/S

That Members consider whether or not to approve the Peugeot 5008 as a Private Hire Vehicle to carry six passengers.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1.0 REASON/S FOR RECOMMENDATION/S

1.1 It is a delegated function of this Panel to approve vehicles that can be licensed as Private Hire Vehicles.

2.0 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

2.1 There is no provision for other options to be considered.

3.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 The Peugeot 5008 complies with the Council's current criteria for licensing Private Hire Vehicles in that it is suitable in type, size and design, is in a suitable mechanical condition and is safe and comfortable.
- 3.2 The vehicle is fitted with six passenger seats however it is licensed to carry four passengers due to the positioning of the rear two seats.
- 3.3 The proprietor of the vehicle, Mr Thomson, has applied to license his vehicle for a further two passengers increasing it to six passengers.
- 3.4 As well as undertaking general private hire work Mr Thomson undertakes work which is subject to a contract to transport children to and from educational establishments. This requires him to transport four children and an escort, however he is currently unable to undertake this work in this vehicle.
- 3.5 The vehicle has been licensed as a private hire vehicle since 19 February 2020 and the current licence is due to expire on 18 February 2021.
