REPORT SUMMARY

3.1 These premises currently have a Premises Licence which permits the following Licensable Activities:

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00

Live Music, Recorded Music and Performance of Dance

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 23:30

Late Night Refreshment

Sunday to Saturday 23:00 to 00:30

Hours Open to the Public

Sunday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:30

Non-Standard Timings

An additional hour has been granted for the supply of alcohol, the provision of late night refreshment and the hours the premises are open to the public on the following days:

Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, Friday, Saturday and Sunday of Bank Holiday weekends and the Thursday before Good Friday.

- 3.2 The Licensing Panel may, having regard to the application for a Review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
 - Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - Revoke the Licence.

The Licensing Authority may decide that no action is appropriate if it finds that the Review does not require it to take any steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

3.3 APPLICATION

- 3.4 An application has been received from Environmental Health to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as Wild Inn. The grounds for the review are in relation to music emanating from the premises and causing public nuisance to Local Residents.
- 3.5 Further information to support the above grounds for the Review is included within the application which is available.

In respect of the review application, six representations have been received from Local Residents who support the application to review the Premises Licence. Copies of the representations are available.

LICENSING AUTHORITY

A representation has been received from the Licensing Authority who have reported that complaints have been received from local residents relating to noise emanating from the premises. As a result of these complaints, the premises have been visited a number of times by a Licensing Enforcement Officer who deemed that the noise coming from the premises undermined the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective. A copy of the representation is available.
