### **REPORT SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is to consider the objections that have been submitted by Merseyside Police in respect of Temporary Event Notices in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The proposed Premises User is **Mark Rogers** and the Temporary Event Notices relate to the Premises known as **Platinum Bar, Conway Street, Birkenhead**.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Licensing Panel are asked to determine whether the Licensing Authority should issue Counter Notices to the Temporary Event Notices following the submission of an Objection Notice by Merseyside Police.
