REPORT SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to consider an application for a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by **Caldy Sports Club Limited** and relates to the premises known as **Caldy Sports Club, Paton Field, Telegraph Road, Caldby, CH48 1NX**.

6.2 The Licensing Authority has a duty to ensure that premises are operated in accordance with Licensing Act 2003 Licensing Objectives. If the Licensing Objectives are undermined this could result in the revocation of a Premises Licence to provide licensable activities.
