- 2.3 The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may, having regard to the application for review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
 - Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - Revoke the Licence.

The licensing authority may decide that no action is necessary if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

- 3.1 An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as the Archers. Merseyside Police have advised that the grounds for review are in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm following a number of incidents that have occurred inside and outside the premises.
