Wirral School HELP Survey 2011 Analysis

1.0 BACKGROUND

The Wirral Health, Education and Lifestyle Profile (HELP) Survey was developed by Wirral LA following the Governments discontinuation of the Tellus Survey in 2010. Its purpose was to capture data in areas that were formerly collected by Tellus regarding emotional health, well being and participation in positive activities. The purpose of this report is to provide an overview of participation in the survey in Wirral schools, provide a summary of the outcomes based on the former Tellus national indicators and make some recommendations on the future of the HELP Survey.

2.0 SCHOOL PARTICIPATION

Wirral schools were invited to participate in the HELP survey during the spring term of the 2010/11 academic year. The survey was split into Primary and Secondary school versions. The primary school version was aimed at pupils in year 6 and the secondary school version at students in years 8 and 10. Questions in both surveys were generally the same, the main differences being drugs related questions and more detailed questions about the respondents future in the secondary school version.

A total of 1460 children across all schools responded to the survey. This compares to 3012 in the 2009/10 Tellus4 Survey. Primary school take up of the HELP survey was similar to the Tellus4 take up: 903 compared with 1063 from Tellus4. Secondary school take up was considerably lower: 555 compared to 1949. This should be taken into account when analysing secondary survey data.

See Appendix 1 Table A for a detailed breakdown of the schools who participated in the survey compared to Tellus4. All schools who participated in the survey will receive a copy of the Wirral summary of responses as well as comparisons of their own schools responses.

3.0 OUTCOMES FROM THE HELP SURVEY

3.1 Former National Indicators

The Tellus Survey contributed to 5 of the former National Indicators. Using the data collected from the HELP Survey together with the definitions of the former National Indicators that Tellus contributed to, the outcomes of the 5 indicators have been calculated in the table below. The table also contains comparisons with the 2009/10 Tellus4 data.

The figure for NI 115 relating to substance misuse looks like a significant improvement on the Tellus4 outcome; however, this may not be directly comparable due to the large difference in numbers who responded to the secondary school survey. This factor should be considered across all the indicators but will be most pronounced for NI 115.

3.2 Highlights from the Survey Responses

3.2.1 Making a Positive Contribution

Local parks, playgrounds and sports club are the most common activities of young people in their free time. Roughly 70% have not used youth centre facilities in the last 4 weeks. The most common things that prevent young people from doing activities they would like to do include the following: cost; activities are not available in their area, and because of not having anyone to go with. 71% of primary school children have taken part in a group activity led by an adult outside of school lessons compared with 57% in secondary school.

The secondary survey focused on places to go on Friday and Saturday nights. 21% said they had been to a youth club. 60% either don't know of or disagree that there are safe places to go on Friday and Saturday nights. 76% don't know or disagree that there are choices of activities available. The cost is given as the main reason for not using public transport (other than not needing to!)

3.2.2 Enjoy and Achieve

72% of secondary school students weren't sure or disagreed that their teachers made the lessons interesting. 34% were not sure or didn't know what lunch time/after school activities were available. 60% responded that other pupils disrupted lessons.

School work and exams followed by bullying are the two areas most worried about by primary school children. For secondary this also was school work and exams followed by what to do after year 11. Most young people walk to school although the next most common means of transport is car.

3.2.3 Staying Safe

Young people generally feel very safe/quite safe in the area they live, travelling to and from school and using public transport. However, 10/12% feel unsafe in the area they live.

359 (42% of) children said they had been bullied at some point in primary school. Of those, 19% said bullying took place in the last 4 weeks and 56% said a few times in the last year. 76% of all primary children said their school deals with bullying quite well or very well.

167 (35% of) students in secondary school said they had been bullied. Of those 21% said bullying took place in the last 4 weeks and 43% said a few times this year. 55% of all secondary students said that their school deals with bullying quite well or very well.

3.2.4 Economic Wellbeing

52% of primary school children plan to stay on to do further education in college or sixth form with 56% saying they think they will go to university/higher education. 33% state they don't know!

61% of students plan to do further education in college or sixth form and 55% saying they would like to go to university. 22% state they still don't know!

Most support when planning for the future comes from family, friends and teachers. 47% of secondary school students said that they get no help from their Connexions advisor.

3.2.5 Being Healthy

Most young people have one or more good friends, although of all the people children feel they can talk to when worried about something, a youth worker is not one of them.

39 primary school children eat 3-4 vegetables of their "five a day", compared to 31% of secondary school students. 12-14% respondents state they eat none! Most young people do something active such as walking, running, sports etc most days each week.

93% of primary school children state they have never smoked. 5% of children state they have been drunk at least once in the last 4 weeks. The secondary survey provided some detail on drug and alcohol misuse which would need further analysis. Overall, 86% of students say they have never taken drugs and 70% say they have never smoked.

3.2.6 Overall

The survey concluded by asking what the top three areas young people in Wirral feel would make their life better. These are as follows:

Primary Schools:

1. More places to spend time with friends
2. More interesting school lessons
3. More organised activities to do

Secondary schools:

1. More interesting school lessons
2. More places to spend time with friends
3. More help to plan for my future

4.0 CONCLUSION

The HELP Survey has provided a considerable amount of data for analysis over and above the calculated indicators and summary provided in this report. To get the best out of this data, responses would need to be analysed further by personnel involved in the strategic areas.

The relatively small numbers who completed the survey in secondary schools makes it difficult to analyse and provide a true reflection of Wirral as a whole. A more robust data set would require active promotion of the survey with schools to improve participation.

The questions in the HELP survey are based on the original Tellus questionnaire; the quality and value of the survey would be enhanced by customising the questions to make them more appropriate to Wirral requirements.

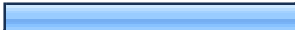

When interpreting the data, two points should be noted which will have affected the outcomes:

- 1552 more children completed the survey Tellus4 survey when compared to the HELP Survey
- 1394 of the 1552 children were from secondary schools

In particular, former NI 115 cannot be directly compared to previous year's data due to specific drugs related questions asked in the secondary version of the survey. The large differences in numbers completing the survey may have caused the figures to become skewed.

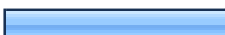

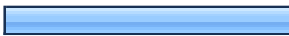

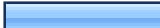
