Causing an obstruction by parking on footways is an offence, for which the police can prosecute.

If you are caught by the Police committing an unnecessary obstruction you could be fined £60 for leaving a vehicle in a dangerous position.

APPENDIX A

Parking irresponsibly, causing an obstruction, means that pedestrians such as wheelchair users, the elderly, the blind and partially sighted and people pushing prams or walking with children as well as all other pedestrians are unable to pass safely on the pavement. They are often forced to walk out into the road to get past, putting them in danger.

Wirral Council has a responsibility to keep our roads and footpaths safe to use. Parking on pavements causes unnecessary damage to the pavement causing your Council additional costs to repair and resurface pavements, kerbs and grass verges. Wirral Council may take legal action against you if you damage the footway.

Drivers mistakenly think that by parking on the pavement they are doing the right thing. In fact, cars parked sensibly on roads mean that vehicles have to give way to each other, and speeds are often lower when this happens.

Park sensibly and with consideration, and make our roads safer for all.
