1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for a Street Collection Permit.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 The Council has resolved to grant Street Collection Permits on a Saturday only, to national and local Wirral charities, with only one collection being carried out on any one Saturday in any one area.

2.2 Upon considering an application to conduct a Street Collection at the Wirral Egg Run on 17 April 2011 Members of this Panel granted a Street Collection Permit having heard that the applicant would have in place the following measures to secure the funds raised by the collection:

- All buckets will be numbered and secured
- A record would be made of the allocation of buckets to specifically named individuals
- Individuals taking part in the collection are known to the organisers and have had all relevant and appropriate checks
- The funds collected will be secured overnight by G4S Security and will be delivered to HSBC Bank on Monday, 18 April for counting
- The Licensing Panel will be provided with details of funds raised and the allocation of these funds

2.3 A summary of the funds raised from the Wirral Egg Run in 2011 and the allocation of these funds has been provided and will be available at the meeting.

3.0 APPLICATION

3.1 An application for a Street Collection Permit has been received from Graham Clarke on behalf of the Wirral Egg Run for Sunday 1 April 2012. The collection is to take place along the route of the Egg Run from New Brighton to Clatterbridge Hospital.
