1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application for the review of a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by Merseyside Police and relates to the premises known as **Five Bars Rest, 61 Borough Road, Seacombe**.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND KEY ISSUES

2.1 The Five Bars Rest currently has a Premises Licence, to allow the following Licensable Activities:

Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Sunday to Saturday 11:00 to 02:00

Hours Open to the Public

Sunday to Saturday 11:00 to 02:30

Regulated Entertainment (Live Music, Recorded Music Performance of Dance and Anything of a Similar Description)

Sunday to Saturday 12:00 to 01:00

Entertainment Facilities (Facilities for Making Music, Dancing and Anything of a Similar Description)

Sunday to Saturday 12:00 to 01:00

- 2.2 The Licensing Act 2003 Sub-Committee may, having regard to the application for review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
 - Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - Revoke the Licence.

The licensing authority may decide that no action is appropriate if it finds that the review does not require it to take any steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

3.0 APPLICATION

- 3.1 An application has been received from Merseyside Police to review the Premises Licence for the premises known as Five Bars Rest. Merseyside Police have advised that the grounds for review are in relation to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder due to the Designated Premises Supervisor being associated with criminal activities.
- 3.2 Further information to support the above grounds for review is included within the application which is available.
- 3.3 Since the application to Review the Premises Licence was made by Merseyside Police, an application has been made to change the Designated Premises Supervisor. Following no objections from Merseyside Police, this application has been granted.
- 3.4 Merseyside Police have made a submission to the Licensing Authority that due to changes that have taken place at the Premises they do not consider it is appropriate to take any further action to address their concerns in respect of the Premises Licence.
- 3.5 Following the submission made by Merseyside Police both the Premises Licence Holder and Merseyside Police are content for the application for the Review to be heard in their absence.
