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| <p>This organisation has supported 158 families this year. Evaluations received in quarter 3 show 97% rated the service as successful with the remaining 3% rating it as average. Assessments completed after the intervention during the quarter show 75% of families said they were supported earlier and 50% reported that their health inequalities was reduced as well as 57% having improved mental health.</p> <p>Quote from a parent <i>"My volunteer is great! Sometimes if I have had a bad night I have a sleep while she is there. She listens to me and helps me think through things"</i></p> |
| <p>3 groups took place this quarter with 30 parents. In the evaluations received three of the outcomes showed 100% improvement in confidence, able to cope with child's behaviour and able to manage anger better within the family. " I feel that things have changed for the better and I am more assertive but I also give him praise and spend more time with him"</p> |
| <p>2 Groups took place and one group had 12 parents and the other 8 parents. All the participants completed the course. In an independent evaluation the parents reported to the commissioner that this course has helped them not to only manage their children's behaviour but also understand it better. "this course was worth the 2 mile walk to get there"</p> |
| <p>This organisation has supported 74families this year and has already exceed the full year targets at no extra cost. Evaluation in this quarter shows that 100% of the families rated the service as successful. Assessments following the completion of the intervention completed during this quarter show that 75% have reported a reduction in the number of incidents of demostic violence and 76% improvement in school attendance and behaviour as well as a77% reduction in Anti Social Behaviour.</p> <p>Quote from a parent <i>"I intend for things to improve even more - we have come on in leaps and bounds since Catch 22 have been working with us. They have helped me a great deal and gave me a lot of insights into things. I am happy with all the help to move forward and to better myself and my daughters life. I feel things are going really well and have greatly ipmproved since P of Catch 22 has been involved"</i></p> |
| <p>Evaluations received in quarter 3 show 95% rated the service as successful with the remaining 5% rating it as average. Post intervention assessments for the quarter report Parental mental health has improved by 79% and 68% reduction in risk taking behaviour. They have also been innovative in working with parents with hearing difficulties by tailoring their work to meet their need. Quote from a parent <i>"We dont know where we would be now if you did not come into our lives. Dont know what we will do without you!"</i></p> |
| <p>This organisation has supported 26 families this quarter. 100% of the participants rated this service as successful.</p> |

From the assessments completed the four outcomes are reporting nearly 100% in each area, including: Improved relationships between parents and children and children feeling safer in reporting abuse. One mother wrote *"have got my daughter back"*

The area has been actively managed by the commissioner and partners which has resulted in this organisation developing their referral routes and have worked with 59 families so far. 100% of participants have rated this service as successful. The interim outcomes which they have achieved so far show (post course assessment to be completed) a positive impact in each of the five outcomes with three of them recording nearly 60%: reduction in levels of risk/harm; improvement in ability to identify abusive/exploitative behaviour and improved self esteem.

In this quarter WMO have supported 30 families. 100% rated this service as successful with 0% rating it as average. This organisation has 47 families being supported to date. The four outcomes have shown a positive outcome with all four of them reporting over a 50% improvement: Increased healthy lifestyles; improved emotional wellbeing and improved wellbeing of children, young people and families. Feedback from one family stated *"thought it was a well balanced course. It made me look at myself and my responses and how they affect/mould my children. Also being able to speak and listen to people in a similar position was helpful: it made me look at the way I approach the way I deal with situations with my children; i feel that the service has helped me and my partner to stick together on family issues and understand the child's behaviour and deal with it. I feel more confident as a parent"*

This organisation is well on track to achieve both its outputs and outcomes, having nearly achieved full year outputs by quarter 3 at no extra cost. 100% of participants rated this service as successful. Assessment completed to date show good achievement of the outcomes agreed with an average achievement of over 85%, ranging up to 100%. The outcomes include: improved mental health & wellbeing, reduced isolation, improved school attendance, reduction in risk and improved age appropriate responsibilities.

Over the last three quarters this service has exceeded the full year outputs by 100% at no extra cost. (216 families supported this year so far) 70% of participants rated this service as successful with 19% recording that the service was average. 62% of the Parents reported that their confidence had improved and were experiencing better relationships with their children. Feedback from referring agency reported *"they had seen A's self esteem rise and marked improvement in her mental health since accessing parenting support"*

This service has achieved its outputs for the year. Impressively 92% of this cohort did not reoffend especially as nearly 80% of the young people this service is working with has some type of disability or has a statement of SEN. 58% of participants rated this service as successful with 27% rating it as average. 73% have reported better relationships, improved behaviour in school and positive engagement in universal services since support began
