This came to a total of 850 attendances. Key work such as 2 Stay Safe operations took place in the New Ferry/Bebington area and Early Intervention Grant activities were attended by approximately 8 young people from the Mersey Park session in December. Feedback on the work in Rock Ferry and Mersey Park has been positive. The Enhanced Outreach Team is currently entering the transitional period moving to a current hot spot area in New Ferry Park, initially for Saturdays only (in order to not duplicate with the Oval session). This has worked well so far, although engagement with a group causing the main anti-social behaviour in the area has been tough due to the large area they are covering. The end aim is for the Birkenhead district team sports workers to back fill at Mersey park on both Friday and Saturday. This has increased our actual output and a continued increase
