1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to consider an application to vary a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by **Mr Gary Laycock** and relates to the premises known as **The Boot**, **55 Wallasey Road**, **Wallasey**.

nuisance being caused by customers leaving the premises at a late hour. Concerns have also been made in relation to the increase of anti-social behaviour which is currently a problem within the vicinity of the premises. Copies of the representations and the petition are available.

A representation has also been received from Ward Councillor, Bernadette Mooney. The representation supports the concerns expressed by Local Residents. A copy of the representation is available.
