WIRRAL PLAN SCRUTINY REPORT

Councillor Ann McLachlan, Cabinet Member - Transformation and Improvement (and Deputy Leader of the Council), said:

REPORT SUMMARY

This report sets out the Scrutiny response to the Wirral Plan Delivery Plan (Phase 1) as reported to Cabinet 8 October 2015. This follows a series of dedicated workshop sessions for non-executive members held in November 2015.

The workshops provided an opportunity for non-executive members to be briefed on the emerging delivery arrangements for each of the Wirral Plan pledges as well as to feed in their comments and suggestions. The sessions were attended by Pledge Sponsors and Leads from the Council and relevant partners. The sessions were well-attended and well-received by non-executive Members.

The scrutiny report is included as Appendix 1. There is a section for each of the Wirral Plan themes: People, Business and Environment. There is a brief description for each of the twenty pledges followed by the comments put forward. This report has been cascaded to pledge sponsors and leads so that comments can be considered and included where appropriate within the Plan’s emerging supporting strategies.

The report supports the development of the Wirral Plan and affects all wards within the borough. It is not a key decision.

In October, a Wirral Plan Delivery Plan (Phase One) was published as a means to further engage partners and consult on delivery arrangements.
- 3.2 The feedback under each of the pledges will be forwarded on to Council and partner leads for each of the 20 pledges. This will enable the emerging strategies in support of the Wirral Plan to be developed to take account of the comments put forward.
