THE GREAT WIRRAL DOOR KNOCK

Working in partnership with you to beat loneliness and isolation in our community

In December 2016 The Great Wirral Door Knock came to Woodchurch for three days. Age UK Wirral worked in partnership with local community organisations, Wirral Council, Magenta Living, Merseyside Police, Merseyside Fire and Rescue Service, Citizens Advice Wirral to speak to residents on their doorsteps about **WHAT'S IMPORTANT TO YOU** and your neighbours. The initiative came about following Age UK Wirral identifying a potential high risk of loneliness amongst older people in parts of Woodchurch.

- Over three mornings we knocked on 895 doors, had 246 conversations with residents, with the majority of these being aged 50+.
- We made 98 referrals to key agencies and services like free home safety checks from Merseyside Fire and Rescue Service and Age UK information and advice.
- Following the Door Knock, a number of people who would otherwise have been alone over Christmas attended Age UK Wirral festive events.
- Asda Woodchurch donated hampers as part of the initiative and these were given to Woodchurch residents via local churches.
- New activities have also started to take place as a result of the Door Knock, for example a coffee morning at Woodchurch Library which brought people together and fostered new friendships.
