We hold a Northern and Southern Rally as well as putting on and attending other shows throughout the year. All of which are very well supported and at times generate much needed money for local charities.

We are also doing well regarding membership to the club which currently stands at around 2,600. A big incentive for joining ourselves lies with the popularity of Ducati's fabulous new models and the dealer referral schemes.
