REPORT SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for the Licensing Panel to consider an application to Review a Premises Licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The application is made by the Licensing Authority and relates to the premises known as Family Shopper at 164-166 Bedford Road, Rock Ferry, CH42 2AS.

RECOMMENDATION

The Licensing Panel is recommended to Review the Premises Licence in respect of the premises known as Family Shopper at 164-166 Bedford Road, Rock Ferry, CH42 2AS.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1.0 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

1.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 it is a statutory requirement for this Panel to determine the application to Review the Premises Licence.

2.0 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

2.1 There is no provision for other options to be considered.

3.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

3.1 The premises currently have a Premises Licence which permits the following Licensable Activity:

The sale of alcohol during the following hours for consumption 'off' the premises only:

Sunday to Saturday 07:00 to 23:00

Hours Open to the Public:

Sunday to Saturday 06:00 to 23:00

3.2 APPLICATION

- 3.3 An application has been received from the Licensing Authority to review the Premises Licence for Family Shopper at 164-166 Bedford Road, Rock Ferry, CH42 2AS. The grounds for the review relate to illegal activity taking place at the premises. It has been identified that individuals have been working at the premises who were not legally entitled to live or work in the United Kingdom. The Licensing Authority considers that this undermines the licensing objective regarding the prevention of crime and disorder.
- 3.4 Further information to support the above grounds for the Review will be provided to the Licensing Panel in advance of the hearing.
- 3.5 The Licensing Panel may, having regard to the application for the Review and any relevant representations, take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Modify the Conditions of the Licence.
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence.
 - Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor.
 - Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months.
 - Revoke the Licence.

The Licensing Panel may decide that no action is appropriate if it finds that the Review does not require it to take any steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.

3.6 REPRESENTATION

HOME OFFICE

A representation has been received from the Home Office who support the application to review the Premises Licence by the Licensing Authority. A copy of the representation will be provided to the Licensing Panel in advance of the hearing.

- 5.1 Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that at any stage, following the grant of a premises licence or club premises certificate, a responsible authority, or any other person, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence or certificate because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the following four licensing objectives:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm

7.0 RELEVANT RISKS
