#### **REPORT SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is for the Licensing Panel to consider an application to license an Iveco-Ford Daily, registration number GN09 MUP as a Private Hire Vehicle, outside of the current age policy for licensing Private Hire Vehicles.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Licensing Panel is recommended to determine whether to license an Iveco-Ford Daily, registration number GN09 MUP, as a Private Hire Vehicle, outside of the current age policy for licensing Private Hire Vehicles.

# SUPPORTING INFORMATION

# 1.0 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

1.1 The Licensing Authority have received an application to license an Iveco-Ford Daily, registration number GN09 MUP, outside of the current criteria for licensing Private Hire Vehicles. It is a delegated function of the Licensing Panel to determine whether to licence a vehicle as a Private Hire Vehicle when it does not comply with the current criteria for licensing Private Hire Vehicles.

## 2.0 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

2.1 That the application to license an Iveco-Ford Daily, registration number GN09 MUP, be determined by an Officer in accordance with the current criteria for licensing Private Hire Vehicles within the Council's Statement of Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy which would result in the application being refused.

## 3.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 The current criteria that vehicles must comply with before being granted a Private Hire Vehicle Licence as set out in the Council's Statement of Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy includes the following:
  - 1. Vehicles must be under 10 years of age from the date of manufacture or date of first registration, whichever is the earliest.
  - 2. Once a vehicle reaches 6 years of age it will be required to be tested every six months and a six monthly licence will be issued.
  - 3. Any vehicle which is more than 9 years and 6 months old will be issued with a licence that will expire on the day before it reaches 10 years old.
- 3.2 The proprietor of the vehicle, Mr Williams of MW Transport, has applied to license the vehicle as a Private Hire Vehicle.
- 3.3 The vehicle was first licensed as a Private Hire Vehicle on 24 January 2019 and the current licence is due to expire on 5 January 2024.
- 3.4 The date of first registration of this vehicle is 29 July 2009.
- 3.5 If a licence is granted, the vehicle will be used to undertake work exclusively under and in strict accordance with the terms and conditions of a contract issued by the Council to transport children to and from educational establishments.
- 3.6 The vehicle has been examined at one of the Council's authorised testing stations and the MOT and Compliance pass certificates will be provided in advance of the meeting.
- 3.7 The vehicle will be available for inspection at the meeting.

## 4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no financial implications arising directly from this report.

# 5.0 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Section 48 (1) of The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides that a district council shall not grant a licence unless it is satisfied that the vehicle is:
  - Suitable in type, size and design for use as a Private Hire Vehicle
  - Not of such design and appearance as to lead any person to believe that the vehicle is a Hackney Carriage
  - In a suitable mechanical condition
  - Safe and Comfortable
  - That there is in force in relation to the use of the vehicle a policy of insurance
- 5.2 Section 48 (7) of The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 states that any person aggrieved by the refusal of a district council to grant a vehicle licence under this section, or by any conditions specified in such a licence, may appeal to a magistrates' court.

# 6.0 **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS: ICT, STAFFING AND ASSETS**

6.1 There are no specific implications arising from this report.

## 7.0 RELEVANT RISKS

7.1 There are safety implications arising out of this report as the Licensing Panel must be satisfied that the vehicle is safe, suitable and comfortable to be licensed as a Private Hire Vehicle. The vehicle has been examined at one of the Council's authorised testing stations and has passed the MOT and Compliance tests.

## 8.0 ENGAGEMENT/CONSULTATION

8.1 This is not a matter that requires consultation.

## 9.0 EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS

9.1 The Licensing Panel must have regard to their Public Sector Equality Duty when considering the application.

# **10.0 ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE IMPLICATIONS**
