Section 2: What Council proposal is being assessed? Review Library Provision of Birkenhead & Wallasey Central Libraries

The New Operating Model is the mechanism to drive delivery of The Library Strategy 2021-26. Together these initiatives strive to provide a balanced, sustainable, modern, and fit for purpose Library Service in Wirral which will ensure that all residents have access to a comprehensive and efficient service. The service model will not be based on the quantity of physical locations but on the right service being provided where it needs to be, adopting a 'needs-based' approach. It recognises co-location of Council services as an underlying principle to better deliver a transformative and connected offer. It is widely acknowledged that both Birkenhead and Wallasey Central Libraries are not currently situated in the optimum locations to deliver the outcomes of the strategy. The Library Service vision is for both to be modern, centrally located, multi-faceted community hub as part of Birkenhead & Liscard redevelopment plans featuring good transport links and accessibility, improved experiences for both users and staff, energy efficient and a single front door for access to council services.
