Consultation must take place over a period of not less than 6 weeks, to bring the application for designation to the attention of those who live, work or carry on business in the area, before the designation of a Neighbourhood Forum and associated Neighbourhood Area can be confirmed.

Statutory consultation took place between 15 December 2023 and 9 February 2024 to bring the application for designation to the attention of those who live, work or carry on business in the area to be affected. The application documents were placed for public inspection on the Council's website and at Birkenhead Central Library. A summary of the other arrangements are set out in section 8.0 of the accompanying Officer Decision Report.

No comments were submitted that would indicate that the designation of the proposed Neighbourhood Forum and proposed Neighbourhood Area should not take place, as applied for.
