# Section 2: What Council proposal is being assessed? ALL AGE DISABILITY AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE DELIVERY REVIEW

Since 17 October 2023, a review of the performance of the Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation (CWP) social work delivery service has been completed in partnership with CWP, the Council's Children and Young Peoples Directorate and Adult Care and Health Directorate. The review has concluded that CWP are providing a good quality, safe and effective service, undertaking of the delivery of the Council's delegated duties under the Care Act 2014 and the Children's Act 2004

It is proposed to extend this agreement under Section 75 of NHS Act 2006 which allows partners (NHS bodies and councils) to contribute to a common fund which can be used to commission health or social care related services, for a further 5 years.

The Council has a statutory duty to meet eligible needs for care and support consistent with the outcome of a Care Act (2014) assessment. It has a duty to meet need in line with the Children's Act (2004). The duty to assess and provide care and support planning for adults and children is delegated to CWP under a Section 75 arrangement, and therefore enables the Council to continue to meet its statutory duties.

Regular meetings have monitored the performance of the section 75 agreement over its lifetime, with an agreed set of performance and activity measures, and have ensured that the service has successfully delivered the Council's delegated statutory duties under the Care Act 2014.

The review has highlighted that children and families are safe and supported to thrive. As part of the extension of the section 75 agreement, CWP will be required to demonstrate continuous development and improvement of these services
