Local context and whole system working: are local partners working in a joined-up way with a shared understanding of priorities and responsibilities for delivery? Are there system-wide and place plans to ensure that local aspirations and NHS Long-Term Plan Commitments are achieved locally?

Sustainability: are actions in place to secure the long-term viability of this work and is its impact being regularly assessed? Have priorities been co-produced with people with lived experience and changes made to reflect their knowledge and insights?

Capacity to deliver: is capacity, including workforce and investments, aligned to local aspirations and national priorities. Do partners have a shared understanding of the risks to delivery and how these will be mitigated?

Service design: do services reflect national guidance and evidence as laid-out in national service specifications, statutory guidance and clinical guidance? Are partners aware of risks to the quality of services and how these will be addressed?
